




### **BUYING GUIDE**



Martin Ray 2009 Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon (Sonoma Mountain). Dry and tannic in youth, this Cabernet shows a cool-climate influence in the earthiness and minerality that frame the black currant and oak flavors. It's a good wine, with a good structure. Give it a few hours of decanting and drink soon. —S.H. abv: 14.2% Price: \$45






# 2009 Martin Ray Sonoma Mountain Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon

**Female judges**: "The nose opens with aromas of a cranberry bog and wet leaves...a fall day on Cape Cod and continues to evolve with toast and rye notes. All of the aromas replicate on the palate with added flavors of blackberry jam and apple butter. This baby makes you pucker with the significant tannin and acidity on the long finish. A wine to ponder."

Male judges: "Cherry, black currant, mint, sweet spice, and wood aromas open to a complex mélange of flavors with dark fruit, earth, and brown baking spices through the late palate. What makes this wine really appealing is the balance and structure."






## 2007 Martin Ray Sonoma Mountain Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon
