Shows a firmly tannic structure, with good acidity and a firm minerality. That's the iron. The velvet is the ripe, rich black currant and cherry fruit. Male judges: "Baked plum, blueberry pie, cranberry juice, and celery root aromas and flavors. Serious acidity and fruit in the mouth."






91 POINTS! MARTIN RAY CABERNET SAUVIGNON STAGS LEAP DISTRICT RESERVE 2007

"This has intriguing complexity tied to the Stags Leap District soil, a dark chocolate layer cake of tannin laced with plump cherry fruit. The soil character gives some pungency to the wine, balancing the richness of the fruit and tannin. The texture is smooth, making this accessible now, though it's also suited to several years of age."-P.C.





"Pretty sharp in tannins and acids, even for a Stags Leap Cab. Although it has plenty of blackberry, cherry, currant and oak flavors, it's a hard wine. 


The Chronicle Recommends: Napa Valley Cabernet
